TECH.2018

Tech. 2018 took place Feb. 21, with 141 onsite attendees based on 180 registrants, with strong presentations, particularly the keynote speaker, global futurist Jack Uldrich. While we did not meet sponsorship and registration goals, expenses were adjusted based on attendance.

SPRING CONFERENCE

This year's conference is Tuesday, April 10 at the Marriott Northwest in Brooklyn Park, and features an excellent line-up of presenters, thanks to our Spring Conference Committee's work, including Thomson Reuters and 3M on artificial intelligence, blockchain technology with Microsoft, Bitwise IO and others, cybersecurity issues with Mayo Clinic, Medtronic and others, big data with Seagate, digital transformation presentations by Target, Best Buy, Cargill and Rimage, and more. 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

Hi-Tech Alliance

MSP TechHire is working with MHTA and DEED to conduct a survey of IT firms around recruiting, hiring, and

retention of workers. The survey should be sent out in late January/early February. Additionally, a regional IT sector strategy convening was hosted by MHTA in conjunction with TechHire and MSPWin in late December. The meeting provided an overview of current IT worker demand, sharing of current and future investments and outcomes by attendees, and discussion of a regional strategy approach. In 2018, this group will join efforts with the recently reconstituted Greater Metro Workforce Council to develop a regional strategy for IT workforce development.

The PIPELINE apprenticeship project is now a full-fledged program of the MN Department of Labor. In addition, the Youth Skills Program has replaced elements of the Youth Career Connection Project. The 2017 Legislature passed a law to enable more high school students to participate in skills-based training at employer sites. The new Youth Skills Training Program will support locally-based programs for "student learners," age 16 and older, participating in paid work experiences, including internships, apprenticeships, and other programs where they receive on-the-job training directly from employers.

MHTA continues to publish a weekly MN Workforce report available at the MHTA website and covering IT, Life Sciences, Science & Engineering, and overall STEM occupations. In association with Real Time Talent, MHTA sponsors an MHTA portal to the Real Time Talent Exchange, an employer/employee matching service.

getSTEM

getSTEM capped our 9th year in December. We nearly matched last year's record-breaking connections between educators and the business community. There has been a steady rate of new accounts and activity in ASKs and OFFERs since the start way back in January 2009. We have helped just under 1,900 educators served over 66,400 students through requests asked for by teachers and answered by our technology community. The getSTEM site also received an upgrade to a new technology platform this fall.

Planning has begun for the September 13, 2018 event. Thomson Reuters has already agreed to serve as the Presenting Sponsor and Unisys will be the Printing Sponsor again. A full slate of unique auction experiences will be offered by leading C-level Technology executives. Three non-profit partners will again provide exciting social hour activities/competitions. Past & current scholarship winners, Foundation volunteers, and other stakeholders will participate as well.

STEM Scholarships

The 2018 STEM Scholarship application period will opened on February 1, 2018. Deadline for submissions will be April 1, 2018. The review process will begin in April and will conclude with final selections in July.

The SciTechsperience Internship Program

- As of March 12, we've placed 95 students (18 more than last year at this time). While we are ahead of last year, we are currently on track to reach about 311 hires.
- Company recruiting: 168 companies have applied since 9/1/17; although as a percentage of our overall goal we are 7% behind where we'd like to be.
- Student recruiting: 980 students have applied since 9/1/17; last year at this time we had 934. Although we are 8% behind, no concerns at this time. Students continue to apply daily, and there are a handful of campus events in March still to come.
- The 4th annual *Jump Start Your STEM Job Search* event took place on February 24 at Augsburg University. The half day program was targeted to students of color, and featured workshops, panel discussions and a keynote by Dr. Raj Rajan of Ecolab. Roughly 70 students attended, who gave the event high marks in the follow up survey. SciTechsperience staff were involved in planning, sponsoring and tabling in the event.
- The SciTech team has two webinars coming up this month: One for students called "Conquering the Networking Beast" on March 29 and one for employers that covers the program basics on March 22. Recordings will be available on the SciTech Spotlight Blog (https://scitechmn.org/blog/).
- Multiple efforts are underway to boost employer recruitment. In addition to the March 22 webinar,
 which has been promoted through DEED and MHTA, our ads and direct mail pieces continue to run
 through this month. Staff have attended several events and will be calling employers from past years
 who haven't posted positions. We continue reaching out to other industry associations to help
 promote the program and are currently working with Mo, MHTA's new communications guru, on

Treating Severe Asthma in the Small Airways: A Novel Inhaled Dry Powder Formulation: Severe asthma is a long-term debilitating and life threatening disease with no cure that remains difficult to treat using current formulations and devices because they deliver very little medication to the small airways. There is consensus that delivery of anti-inflammatory medication to under-treated small airways will have a major impact on reducing pulmonary inflammation in severe asthmatics and reducing side effects associated with undesired mouth-throat deposit. Based on preliminary data we will develop a novel dry powder formulation and delivery method to target small airway inflammation in order to control symptoms of severe asthma. (The company is seeking angel investment capital to support its commercialization strategy.)

The 2018 Legislative Session began on February 20, with action picking up over the last few weeks. We are seeing progress on the Angel Investment Tax Credit, hearing positive news from the chair of the Senate Tax Committee, but there is still work to be done in the House of Representatives. The Department of Revenue has a proposal to scale back the data center tax incentive, which we are working to oppose with other stakeholders. A couple of bills related to broadband have been introduced, including one that would fund the Border-to-Border Broadband Development Grant Program at \$51.48 million in FY19. House and Senate authors have introduced a bill that would modify how workforce development funds are allocated, which could significantly (and potentially adversely) impact funding for SciTechsperience.

OPERATIONS & FINANCIAL

January thru February YTD financials are showing net income at \$302,890 vs a budgeted net of \$308,076. While Tech.2018 revenue was down, the net income came in very close to plan (24K).

On the revenue side, new membership is running behind plan by \$2K, and renewals by\$37K. The ACE Leadership Program is running ahead of budget by 10K, due to increased participation. WLIT (Women Leading in Technology) running behind plan by \$2K, off in sponsorship and registration, and Tech.2018 came in at \$12K behind plan, the majority shortage in sponsorship. SciTechsperience running at plan, just slightly off the monthly schedule.

Admin expenses running right at plan, staffing slightly under (10K). Event expenses running under plan, overall expenses \$19K under plan.

Year end adjustments and audit prep is being worked on, with audit fieldwork happening April 23rd.
